Young workers aged 18-24 yrs are faced with increased risk of suffering harm on the job due to their limited work experience, lack of job skills and are still developing physically and psycho-socially. This demands for workplace safety and health be promoted for workers of all ages, and most urgently for the youth

In the workplace, young workers should: -

- Receive basic OSH training before being assigned to perform job tasks
- Be fully trained in their job tasks and provided appropriate on-the-job supervision
- Be protected against their right to refuse to perform work that presents an imminent danger to their safety or health

Our Campaign calls for promotion of the ratification and application of key ILO Conventions on occupational safety and health (OSH) and in particular:

- Occupational Safety and Health Convention, 1981 (No. 155);
- Safety and Health in Agriculture Convention, 2001 (No. 184),
- Promotional Framework for Occupational Safety and Health Convention, 2006 (No. 187)
